IRS payroll expense data collected in 2004 show a total of 3,181 public charities that paid wages to one or more employees; the total amount paid came to \$7.3 billion. (The corresponding figures for 2001 are 3,252 and \$6.4 billion.)

### ***Organizational Size***

The number of large 501(c)(3)s in Washington has been growing rapidly. In 2001, 442 had assets of over \$10 million and a total of just over \$40 billion in assets; in IRS records for 2006, this number has grown to 525, with total end-of-year assets of \$80 billion. It is still true, however, that the overwhelming majority of nonprofits are small; 80% have assets under \$100,000 and those assets total less than \$186 million for all 26,355 organizations (an average of a little over \$7,000 each).
